Reference is made to your request for information relative to John Blakeney, a Revolutionary War soldier of Chesterfield County, South Carolina.

The data which follow were obtained from papers on file in the pension claim, %.2716, based on the military service of the only John Blakenay of South Carolina that is found in the Revolutionary War records of this office.

John Blakeney was born January 14, 1758, in Bute County, North Carolina. The names of his parents are not shown. We moved with his father from Bute County to Rowan County, near Salisbury, and from there to South Carolina.

Thile a resident of Chesterfield Tistrict, South Carolina, John Slakeney enlisted and served as private with the South Carolina troops as follows: in 1776 served two months under Captain Tentain Tilliam Tust and Major Loyd; next served two months under Captain Tilliam Tust and Major Loyd; next served two months under Captain Tilliam Tust and Major Loyd; next served two months under Captain Tentifies and Colonel Tenton and was in an engagement with the Tritish at Wedboo near Monks Corner. We then wont to Mecklenburgh County, North Carolina, to see his relatives there and soon enlisted and served three months as private in Captain Rogers' company in Colonel Merkin's Morth Carolina regiment. He then returned enlisted and served two months as private with South Carolina troops under Captain Deason and Colonel Marshall. We served from February 5, 1779, until April 4, 1779, as quartermaster with South Carolina troops under Captain Deason and Colonel Marshall. We served twenty-eight days with South Carolina troops as adjutant in Colonel William Bratton's regiment.

John Flakeney died March 30, 1848, in Chesterfield District, South Carolina.

This soldier married in 1735 or 1736 in Anson County, North Carolina, Mancy May.




