John Brown maketh oath before
me Abraham Vott one of the judges
of the supreme court of Law of the State
aforesaid that he enlisted as a soldier
in the continental army in the year
1777 under Col. Isaac Huger of the
South Carolina line - that he was
afterwards transferred to the third
regiment and continued in service
until discharged at the end of the
war - that he is now in reduced cir-
cumstances and stands in need of
the aid of his country for support -
whereon to and subscribed this third day
of December 1777 John Brown
before me
Abm. Vott

I do hereby certify that I am ^{notified} that the
within mentioned John Brown was
in the continental army as a common sol-
dier during the revolutionary war for more
than nine months - and that he is in
indigent circumstances & needs the aid of his
country for support - Given under my hand
& the seal of the court this 10th day of Jan^r 1819 -

On this eleventh day of April 1821 personally appeared in open Court, being a Court of Record, exercising unlimited jurisdiction in both civil & criminal cases at Law for the said District, John M. Brown aged sixty years and nine months, resident in said District, who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary war six years, a part of said six years in the fifth Regiment, under Captains Hubrick, Potts and Martin and a part of said six years in the third Regiment under Captain Walker. He was Major and Colonel of the fifth Regiment of South Carolina line.

and has received a pension certificate from the war Department, Number 7282.

And I do solemnly swear that, I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 15th day of March 1778 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary war" passed on the 15th day of March 1778 and that I have not nor has any person for me, in bond, any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule herunto annexed by me subscribed.

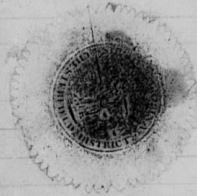

These are to certify that Mr John
Brown ^{was} a Soldier in the 5th Reg^t of
South Carolina Continental Troop and immediately
after the Battle at Savannah he was trans-
ferred to my Company in the 3rd Regt.
Commanded by Col. ^{John} Dickinson and
that he fought ^{valiantly} during his time as good
Soldier in the same, and after we were
taken prisoners at the Fall of Charleston
he continued as a waiter to me until the
Troop were discharged at Charleston where
he had his Discharge, he is a man about
five feet eight or ten inches high of a Sallow-
Complexion with brown hair well made
and at that ^{time} about Eighteen years of age
and that it is the same person who has
Come on me for this Certificate at this time.
