




Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letger in which you request the Revolutionary War records of Thomas Davis of South Carolina, who married Nancy Rivers; Fradbury Gilman, Simeon Gilman, and Frederick Rivers.

Revolutionary War data furnished by this office are obtained from claims made to the United States for pension and bounty land based upon the military service of soldiers in that war.

A search of the records fails to show such claims on file on account of the services of Bradbury Gilman, Sisson Gilman, and Frederick Rivers. It is suggested possible means of securing data relative to the military service of these soldiers, that you apply to the Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, D. G.

The data furnished herein were obtained from the papers on file in pension claim, W. 8655, based upon the Revolutionary War service of Thomas Davis.

He was born March 22, 1780 in Chesterfield District, South Carolina; the names of his parents are not given.

Thomas Davis served as a private with the South Carolina troops (specific dates of service not

given), as follows—

He enlisted a short time before Christmas and served nine months in Captain Norris (Naurice) Murphy's company, under Major Robert Lloyd; one month in Captain John DeWitt's company, Colonel George Hicke' regiment; from February 8, in Captain Ellerbee's company, Colonel George Hicke' regiment; was taken prisoner at the ciage of Charleston, May 11, and was discharged on parole, May 19; one months in Captain William Preswood's company; one month in Captain William Preswood's company; one month in Captain Benton' middle woods and two tours of two weeks each on scouting duty, no names of officers given.

The soldier, Thomas Davis, was allowed pension on his application executed March 17, 1836, then a resident of Chesterfield District, South Carolina. It is also stated that he was penaloned by the state of South Carolina. He died March 20, 1845 in Chesterfield District.

Thomas Havis married in the year 1737 or 1788, in Chesterfield District, South Carolina, Nancy Rivers.

Pension was allowed on an application executed February 16, 1853, at which time the widow, Nancy Davis, was referred to as of "extreme old age". She died December 15, 1853.

They had ten children and reared nine of them. Their first child, Samuel, was born in the summer of 1788, and went to the "western country" about 1838; second child, William, was sixty-three of age in 1853 and living in Chesterfield District, South Carollan; their youngest child was born in December, 1812; the name of the youngest child not given, nor are the names of other children shown.


The soldier, Thomas Davis, referred to an elder brother, but did not state his name. William Rivers was born February 25, 1778 and in 1852 a resident of Chesterfield District, South Carolina, and referred to the widow, Nampy Davis, as his aunt; he stated that

his son, Malachia was, was born August 12, 1812.

There are no further data in this claim relative to family.
