Amson County. On this 4th day of May 1833, I Stephen Rushing one of the acting Justices of the Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions in & for the County of Amson South Carolina near the State line. Personally appeared Thomas ^{aged 76 years} very old & blind of Christfield District South Carolina he being very infirm residing near the State line where he has resided a few years that he was formerly of Amson County South Carolina the reason why he makes application in this County & this way it is most convenient and easy for him in his present situation in life & Fayetteville the nearest office for as a Soldier of the Revolution after having been duly sworn by me according to Law doth on his oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Provision made by the Act of Congress Passed June 7th 1832.

He entered the service of the United States in the Revolutionary War in the Year 1776 as well as now recollects the day or Month not recollects he served as herein stated as well as he now recollects his services as was under the following named officers. He was first a private & substitute for his Father William Henry Six Months under Capt. Bias Maj. Johnson Col. Dolson & was Marched to Hillsborough South Carolina joined Gen. Stephens then through the State to South Carolina and joined Gen. Galt at Ridgebury Mill & from there to near Camden & there had a Battle with the British & was defeated then under Gen. Marion & when his term of service expired discharged by his officers & returned home then that time then a private & substitute for Nathaniel Henry Eighteen Months the day Month or year not recollects he Marched under Capt. John H. Himey to Pennedward County Court House from there to the forks of James River then joined Gen. Sherman & had a fight with the British Dragoons Cross the river & Lieutenant Gills was killed then Marched to Pennedward County House then joined Col. Washington's Horse & there was received as a Horseman then Marched to Dixes Ferry on Dan River from there Marched to Guilford Court House in South Carolina and joined Gen. Green at or about the time Gen. & Wallace's and fighting was not in the Battle then was Marched to South Carolina and was in the Battle at the Cowpens with Gen. Morgan & defeated the British & continued in South Carolina till the time of his service expired & was discharged by Capt. Garner & returned home then some time then was drafted for three years or during the War the Year day or Month not recollects & Marched under Maj. Norflet to Pennedward Court House then under Capt. Hamilton Maj. McKinnay Col. Bennett then Marched to Cartersville on James River then to Manchester from there to Fredericksburg then joined Gen. Washington & about to many places to Yorktown was there at the taking of Wallace & was there discharged by Capt. Hamilton the 2nd day of October 1781 - served two years & six months returned home to Ridgebury County Virginia there resided one year then moved to Granville County North Carolina & there continued twenty years then moved to Amson County South Carolina & continued there

till a few years past then moved a crop the state line in Charlesfield District South Carolina & reside at times in each state now & then

A^t I was a substitute too years then Drafted for three years or during the course I served too years & six months at that time
- Q^t 5. State the Names of some of the regular officers who were with the Troops when you served such Continental & Militia regiments as you can recollect
A^t Gen^l John Deas Gen^l Green County Militia Gen^l Stephen Cole Dolmowell & Boyce
- Q^t 6. Did you ever receive a Discharge from the service & if so by whom was it given & what has become of it
A^t I was from the different officers whom he served under but has lost them
- Q^t 7. State the Names of persons to whom you are known in your present neighborhood & who can testify as to your Character for Veracity & their belief of your services as a Soldier of the revolution

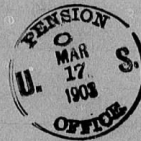

I have been requested by one of the
Sons of Thomas Terry late of this District
and who received a Pension during his
time as a Revolutionary Soldier, to make
inquiry at your office whether or not there
is any thing due him at the time of his
death or whether after his death, the Law
makes any provision to pay the heirs any
thing for any time after the death of the
Pensioner. I have stated to the heirs that
my opinion was in regard to the matter, that
the Pension ceased at the death of the
Pensioner. But this does not seem to satisfy
them — Will you inform as to the facts of
the Case, so that I can give them the
information which they desire.

I know Thomas Terry but when he died
I cannot now say, but some ten years
ago —

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 22nd day of May 1784, in the name of Thomas Terry as a Soldier of infantry for \$ 22, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to himself and was given for services prior to the 1st January 1782.
